2010 TIRE PRESSURE SURVEY FACT SHEET – New York City Metro Area¹

- Only 23% of vehicles had four properly inflated tires.
- Nearly 52% of vehicles had at least one under inflated tire.
- 5% of vehicles had at least one tire under inflated by 8 pounds per square inch (psi).
- 8% of vehicles had at least one tire under inflated by 6 psi.
- 24% of vehicles had at least one tire under inflated by 4 psi.
- Tires may lose up to 1 psi per month.
- Many vehicles equipped with tire pressure monitoring systems would not issue a warning even after a drop in tire pressure of 8 psi. These systems issue a low pressure warning only after tire pressure drops 25%.
- Properly inflated tires can improve fuel efficiency by 3.3% and save \$.09 a gallon at the pump. Approximately 1.2 billion gallons of fuel are wasted each year by U.S. motorists driving on under inflated tires.
- The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) estimates that under inflated tires contribute to more than 600 fatalities and 33,000 injuries each year.
